A, AN – a, an + singular countable noun

(Can I have a pear, please?, It is an ananas.)

SOME – 1) some + plural countable nouns – positive

sentences (There are some oranges.)

2) some + uncountable nouns – positive

sentences (There are some honey.)

ANY – 1) any – we use in negative sentences (countable and uncountable nouns): I don't have any apple.

There isn't any rice.

2) any – we use in most question (countable and uncountable nouns): Have you got any cucumbers?

Are there any jam?
